Happy June! During the last week of May, Governor DeWine called for a special session to ensure that President Biden would be on the November ballot. Instead of a clean bill, Republicans used their supermajority to attack some of Ohioans most sacred fundamental freedoms. HB 1 is a preemptive strike against this year's citizen-led ballot initiative to reform the redistricting process in Ohio.

On June 19th, we observe Juneteenth, a day to celebrate African American freedom and progress. Although there is still so much work to do, we have to acknowledge our achievements thus far. As a Black man who happens to be a State Representative, I am my ancestors dream. I will continue to prioritize building up Black families with legislation centered around maternal health, housing, education, jobs and criminal justice reform.

June is also Pride Month! We must be an inclusive state where all people, no matter their gender identity or sexual orientation, can live, work and raise a family safely and securely. No one should live in fear of being bullied, fired, or otherwise discriminated against simply because of who they are or who they love.

• Currently waiting for its 1st hearing in the House Economic and Workforce Development Committee


