Last month, House Democrats passed House Bill (HB) 2, the state's biennial state capital budget. The record-setting \$6.2B investment makes appropriations for state-owned infrastructure, colleges, universities, and school districts as well as other community projects.

In addition to the \$3.51B in traditional capital funds and a \$1.98B appropriation for ongoing projects, HB 2 includes an additional \$700M in state funds that will be directly invested into transformative community projects designed to generate further development & economic opportunity across the state. These state funds were able to be set aside due to the influx of federal relief dollars that helped to supplement the state's balance sheet during the most recent state operating budget.



District 20 receives over \$65 Million in Capital Budget Funding

Representative Upchurch was the primary sponsor of a record-setting \$6.2 Billion investment and was able to bring over \$65 Million back to Cleveland. The following projects were awarded State dollars:
