Not accepted electronic materials:

Household appliances (e.g., blenders, microwaves, ovens, refrigerators, toasters), vacuum cleaners, lamps, or lightbulbs of any kind.

National Work and Family Month

Too many hardworking Ohioans are feeling the squeeze of high costs for everyday expenses, such as healthcare, groceries, and rent. I am proud to support legislation to reduce costs for Ohio families, including these bills:

- Eliminate the Diaper Tax (HB 695). Helps families spend more time with their newborn and less time worrying about the cost of diapers.
- Caregiver Expenses Tax Credit (HB 79).
 Reducing costs for important caregiving services by putting more money back in your pocket.
- Earned Income Tax Credit (HB 59). This
 is a tax cut for those that need it most:
 Ohio's middle class.

The Ohio Department of Education released their 2021-2022 State school report card data.

A few changes were made to what is reported as required by <u>HB 82</u>, which became effective 9/30/2021. The latest edition of the Ohio School Report Cards will feature ratings of 1-5 stars in five categories: achievement, progress, early literacy, gap closing and graduation.
