Following Issue 1's amazing victory, House Democrats introduced the Reproductive Care Act, legislation to reduce barriers to accessing abortion and reproductive healthcare. The bill will repeal existing statutes related to abortion care, such as mandatory 24-hour waiting periods, transfer agreements, and TRAP laws. It will also add protections related to patients and providers including data privacy, nondiscrimination, along with civil and criminal protection for evidentbased care.

For years, the extreme majorities in Ohio's state legislature have been making it harder for patients to access abortion care and for providers to provide the proper, comprehensive care their patients need. The Reproductive Care Act is the first step in this multifaceted process to remove barriers to reproductive health care that exist in Ohio. Protecting women's reproductive rights happens when we work on reducing barriers to care. House Democrats will continue to work to ensure patients and providers are protected.





The end of year is always a busy time at the Ohio Statehouse and in our local communities. Rep. Russo was pleased to welcome the Upper Arlington Girls Water Polo State Championship team and the Ohio Carolina Synchro-Swim Club Junior Olympic gold medalists to the Statehouse. She also hosted Grandview Heights Daisy Troop #6838 and showed them around the House Chambers to help them earn their democracy badge. Following the recent reporting about the state of Ohio's juvenile justice system, Rep. Russo also sat down with SEIU members who work in youth detention centers around the state to talk about their ideas for improving the system and employee safety. In the district, Rep. Russo joined OSU Wexner Medical staff for a tour of the new hospital tower being built; she celebrated Maryhaven's 70th Anniversary serving Central Ohio and discussed how the state can continue to support comprehensive treatment for addiction and mental illness; and she paid a visit to Barrington Elementary where she spoke with students about being a good citizen. Rep. Russo was also honored to receive the Ohio Domestic Violence Network's Leadership in Policy Award for her work at the Statehouse on behalf of domestic violence survivors.
