Dear Neighbor,

The redistricting process is still ongoing, as a majority of the Ohio Redistricting Commission voted to pass another set of partisan state legislative maps that fail to comply with the Constitution and Court requirements. Democrats voted against the state maps. If approved by the Supreme Court, the maps will last for only four years. Instead of proportional and fair districts, the majority again passed maps that fail to comply with the Constitution and do not accurately reflect the statewide preferences of Ohio voters. These maps ignore the will of Ohioans, and defy the Supreme Court's orders. Democrats had introduced a state map proposal that complied with all constitutional requirements, including reflecting the preferences of Ohio voters. This proposal was rejected by the Republican commissioners on Feb. 17.

Instead of pushing back the May Primary due to the uncertainty, House Republicans pushed through an amendment to an unrelated bill and used a dirty procedural trick to pass it. The amendment significantly cuts the amount of time our military and overseas voters have to receive their ballots and get them back in the mail by Election Day. We should not be shortchanging our service members because unreasonable Republicans in Columbus refuse to move the primary to a date that will allow access for all Ohioans to vote. Our service members, who protect our freedom to vote every day, deserve better than this rushed bill and rushed election.

On February 25th, 2022 President Biden nominated Judge Ketanji Brown Jackson to be a U.S. Supreme Court Justice. Judge Brown Jackson is currently a member of the U.S. Court of Appeals for the D.C. Circuit. According to the Pew Research Center, only 2% of Federal judges have been Black woman. The nomination of Judge Brown Jackson to the U.S. Supreme Court is an important step towards a more accurate representatives of our nation's population. In February, I joined my fellow members of the Ohio Democratic Women's Legislative

Caucus to write to President Biden and urge him to fulfill his promise to nominate a qualified Black woman to the Supreme Court. President Biden's historic selection is a meaningful step to addressing social inequalities and inequities in our country, one that will have a lasting impact.

- Rep. Sobecki filed House Bill 570 which fives a tax break to Ohioans who received late Unemployment benefits during the pandemic.
