





Rep. Report

On October 17th, the Joint Medicaid Oversight Committee voted to approve the Medicaid growth rate at 3.8% for Fiscal Year 2026 and 3.7% in Fiscal Year 2027. This growth rate limits the amount that the governor may request in Medicaid funds for next year's budget.

In state fiscal year 2022, Medicaid constituted 39% of Ohio's state budget at \$35 billion. The growth rate may equate to a \$1.5 billion dollar increase in Medicaid's budget over the next biennium.

I was the lone 'no' vote for this growth rate. Our middle class is suffering, and the state needs to control our spending. Last budget, the legislature approved historically higher rate increases. Regardless, we keep throwing money at the system.
