

SSG Jack W. Coy Memorial Highway

This month, I was able to introduce a bipartisan bill HB 641. HB 641 is entitled, the SSG Jack W. Coy Memorial Highway. The bill passed unanimously out of the House Transportation Committee. This bill would if successful will designate a portion of Interstate Route 280 as "SSG Jack W. Coy Memorial Highway."

As a 20-year-old resident of Lucas County, Staff Sargent Coy joined the United States Army Air Force where he became a tail gunner onboard the B-24J "Liberator." Staff Sargent Coy and his fellow airmen fought honorably to defend Europe from the advancement of Axis power. On February 24th, 1944, the "Liberator" was shot down with Staff Sargent Coy onboard.

Thanks to the hard work from family members and advocacy groups, Staff Sargent Coys remains were identified nearly 80 years later, finally providing closure for his loved ones.

The goal of this bill is to guarantee that Staff Sargent Coy's bravery is not forgotten and will serve as a reminder for generations to come of the sacrifice he made.

I would like to personally my joint sponsor Rep. Josh Williams for his support as well as Shawnelle Johns—the great niece of SSG Coy. She came to Columbus and provided the Transportation committee with an in depth and moving testimony regarding SSG Coy and his family's legacy in Northwest Ohio. This is a big deal for the people of Oregon, Ohio and our region.



As the legislature prepares to close for this 135 general assembly—there are a lot of committee hearings, and discussions regarding existing and future legislation. I would like to thank the Ohio Nurses Association for the support and testimony on the HB 285 Safe Patient Care Act. It is bill that will support our patients as well our nurses in our Ohio hospitals. I would like to thank everyone who came down from Toledo to support and provide testimony.
