I recently had the honor of being selected as a delegate for the German American Chamber of Commerce's (GACC) Smart Grid Trip to Germany. The delegation was comprised of industry experts, government officials, and experts from the GACC. The trip featured a variety of briefings on electricity and other energy infrastructures in Germany and how they may be applicable to the United States' energy system, opportunities to discuss practices from around the world with industry experts, site visits to examine what the practices discussed look like on the ground-level, meetings with officials at the US Embassy in Berlin and German leaders, and networking opportunities with business leaders who are interested in investing in Ohio. The trip was a great opportunity to learn about how a similarly positioned country intends to plan for the future of their electricity grid as a key part of national energy policy.

I met with Peter and his team to discuss and preview some of the practices that were the center of attention of the trip, and their insight was greatly helpful.
