Last month, the House passed House Bill 2, the state's biennial state capital budget. The record-setting \$6.2B investment makes appropriations for state-owned infrastructure, colleges, universities, and school districts as well as other community projects. I am pleased to announce \$31.1M in historic funding for Toledo, which included \$950,000 for Ottawa/ Jermaine Park renovations, making it more accessible for all. With all of the exciting announcements regarding the passage of HB 2 and its historic funding going to all parts of District 44 (Lucas, Wood, and Ottawa counties), I must say thank you to my colleagues and collaborators for their assistance. I want to thank each of you who participated, followed the various processes and believed in our plan as I advocated and petitioned to secure funding and resources back to our region. 
