Representative Mohamed's Legislative Updates



Representatives Mohamed and Williams presented sponsor testimony Tuesday before the Insurance Committee on House Bill 595, legislation that would require uninsured motorist coverage in all auto liability policies issued in Ohio. The bill aims to protect responsible drivers from bearing the financial burden of crashes caused by uninsured motorists.

“Drivers who follow the law should not be financially punished because someone else chooses not to be insured,” Rep. Mohamed told the committee, emphasizing that the bill creates a basic, consistent level of protection for Ohioans on the road.
