Ohio School Report Cards Are In!

Out and About

The data is in! In September the Department of Education and Workforce released 2022-2023 School Report Cards for Ohio's public schools. Schools are ranked on a 1-5 star rating system in five categories: achievement, progress, early literacy, gap closing and graduation.

I'm proud to recognize **Columbus Alternative High School** and **Mifflin STEM Elementary School** on their earning four stars in this years report! A full list of school rankings can be found online at reportcard.education.ohio.gov.

It continues to be one of my top priorities to support public schools, teachers, and most of all, our students. We owe sincere gratitude to our Columbus City Schools teachers who have dedicated themselves to bettering our community.

The new state budget helps our schools by:

- $\rightarrow~$ Continued implementation of the <u>Fair School Funding</u> Plan
- → Columbus City Schools funding increased by 15.5%, \$27 Million Dollars, over two years
- → Increased funding for school transportation
- → Increased Special Needs Scholarship Program funding
- → Funding for <u>literacy</u> improvement and professional development programs
- → Increased funding for student <u>dropout recovery</u> and prevention programs
- → Increases base <u>teacher salary</u> from \$30K to \$35K
- → Increased funding for <u>reduced price breakfast and lunch</u>
