This month features Black Maternal Health Week and Minority Health Month.

The week of April 11-17 is Black Maternal Health

Week. Black mothers are 3 times more likely to die from pregnancy-related complications compared to white women.

We know that as health care providers we need to do better to address implicit biases and to provide more opportunities for minority medical students and physicians. Systemic racism hurts all of us regardless of our race. The book, **"Weathering: The Extraordinary Stress of Ordinary Life in an Unjust Society" by Arline Geronimus** does a wonderful job of showing the connection between stress and health especially in marginalized communities.

National Minority Health Month is observed in April and focuses on the health disparities minority communities experience in the United States. Black men are more likely to die from cancer than Caucasian men, and Black women are more likely to die from breast cancer than white women.

Social determinants of health such as poverty, unequal access to health care, lack of education, stigma and racism are underlying contributing factors. We must provide more linguistically and culturally appropriate health education as well as remove barriers to receiving healthcare. House Democrats will continue to support quality, equitable healthcare so that everyone, no matter their zip code, can succeed.

HJR 1 Update

What does HJR 1 Do?

- Requires 60% of the vote to pass constitutional amendments
- Silences the voices of Ohio voters when deciding what issues matter most

How is HJR1 moving through the house?

- It received its first hearing recently in the House Constitutional Resolutions Committee
- HJR 1 now awaits its second hearing in committee. You can watch the hearing recording at <u>www.ohiochannel.gov</u>.

Even if you don't support reproductive rights, this ballot amendment would mean that every time a citizen wanted to

change the constitution it would require 60% to vote for it. In essence, the majority would control any constitutional changes in Ohio. Since 1912, when the voters passed a set of amendments to get rid of corruption, no amendment has hit the 60% threshold and most that have passed were in the 50-55% range. Ohioans have used this approach sparingly over the years.

Unfortunately, at the time of this newsletter the Republicans are using a discharge petition to force the bill to be voted on in Session. It eliminates the option for the Speaker to bring it up for a vote and is yet another attack on our democracy.

You can track these bills and sign up to be notified when committees meet by going to <u>www.ohiohouse.gov/</u> <u>legislation</u>. You can also come in to give testimony by filling out a witness form. We accept written testimony too but in person testimony is very powerful. Our office is willing and able to assist in submitting testimony for any of these bills.
