On Tuesday June 25th, I held a press conference to bring attention to the package of reproductive rights bills. HB 343, HB 502, and HB 565 build upon the rights now guaranteed in our state Constitution. They would repeal archaic restrictions on abortion care, protect IVF, and require that crisis pregnancy centers provide real and unbiased medical care with the state dollars they receive. With the potential for a national abortion ban at the federal level, it is imperative that we protect the will of the voters here in Ohio and continue to work on improving maternal and infant mortality through common sense legislation.



I am grateful to my joint sponsors on these bills, Rep. Liston, Rep. Brown-Piccolantonio, and Rep. Grim for their support and dedication to these bills.
