Dear Neighbor,

The 135th General Assembly is well underway in Columbus. This month we received our committee assignments, allowing us to work on improving our state and communities. Work has begun on various bills that will be debated and voted on in committee as well as on the floor of the House.

We must continue to emphasize the need to improve the lives of all Ohioans. Recently, Governor DeWine gave his State of the State speech, including his priorities for Ohio. It is encouraging that his list included more to address Ohio's mental health crisis, including among our children. It is asserted that unsupervised access to social media is a contributing factor to the problem. A provision in the proposed budget would require parental consent for anyone under age 16 to access social media platforms. Preventing criminal firearms usage and assuring quality public education for all of Ohio's children should also be emphasized.

It is also encouraging to see the emphasis on career tech programs in the budget. The career tech sector is experiencing greater enrollment numbers in recent years. As mentioned in last month's newsletter, these programs can build Ohio's workforce by preparing students for careers in technology and trades that will place them in good-paying jobs, attract new businesses to Ohio, improve the state's economy, and many additional benefits, such as improved housing that more Ohioans can afford.

Black history is American history. February is Black History Month, a time to honor and celebrate Black voices, experiences, and people who have helped shape our state and country. We must all continue the struggle each day to build a state that supports and uplifts Black Ohioans, and commit ourselves to that "more perfect union" described in our U.S. Constitution that guarantees freedom, liberty, and equality for us all.


Late last month, I was privileged to announce recent funding approvals within Cuyahoga County to increase workforce development initiatives within our community. The \$10 million approval will go towards improving workforce participation, and expand apprenticeship opportunities within the construction sector—a win-win for our community and the employers that we seek to attract to build and grow economic opportunities within our region.

The legislation would set aside these funds from the American Rescue Plan Act (ARPA) and create approximately 3,000 jobs through Ohio Means Jobs. This is exactly the kind of priorities that our community needs—improving our infrastructure, law enforcement, and ensuring that our great state continues to provide the resources and opportunities for our families and friends to thrive.



Within the past year, the lengthy proceedings of the Ohio Redistricting Commission resulted in a change in district maps between the 134th and 135th General Assemblies. For that reason, you may reside in an entirely different district without even knowing it, leading to potential confusion regarding the identity of your elected officials in Columbus and who to contact in the event you require assistance.

I am contacting the railroad and the Ohio Department of Transportation to request a meeting concerning the condition of this bridge.

NORTH ROYALTON—At the request of Mayor Larry Antoskiewicz, I recently contacted the Ohio Department of Development for an update on the City's request for HB 45 state funding assistance to repair and upgrade it's wastewater management system. The department is currently analyzing the many requests it has received. Hopefully, there will be a response in the next few months.

CLEVELAND—I recently visited with some of the staff and students at Seeds of Literacy, a free program for students to attain their high school equivalency education. The school has been in existence for 25 years, offering educational counseling, GED preparation, one-to-one tutoring, and both on-site and virtual academic assistance.
