I am excited to introduce the **Ohio Medical Debt Fairness Act - House Bill 257** with **Representative Jean Schmidt (R-Loveland)**.

Medical debt can happen to anyone. No one chooses to get sick or injured. No one plans for a car accident, a cancer diagnosis, or an unexpected hospital stay. Yet for too many, this is exactly how medical debt begins. The Ohio Medical Debt Fairness Act offers three commonsense solutions to protect Ohio families:

- Caps the maximum interest rate for medical debt to 3% per year
- Prohibits hospitals, providers, and collectors from reporting medical debt to credit agencies
- Prohibits wage garnishment for medical debt collections

No Ohioan should avoid obtaining medical out of fear of ruining their finances. I will continue to advocate for the passage of the Ohio Medical Debt Fairness Act to stop medical debt from ruining lives.
