It's been just over a year since I was sworn in as your State Representative - and what a year it has been! Representing our communities is a responsibility I take very seriously and I'm so proud of what we've been able to accomplish. From delivering on local jobs and infrastructure priorities to taking on high healthcare costs to increasing funding for our local public schools to improving worker safety to standing up for survivors of domestic violence and sexual violence, I've been proud to work with members of both parties to meet tough challenges and get things done.

At the same time, it has too often been necessary to stand up to extremism in the Statehouse and fight for our citizens' fundamental rights. When the majority tried to change Ohio's constitution to make it easier for special interests to rewrite the rules, we fought them at the ballot box - and won. In spite of the obstacles we face, I'm optimistic about Ohio's future and honored to serve you. With the 2025-2026 Capital Budget process now underway, I am intensely focused on bringing new investment to our communities and look forward to sharing more information with you soon.

Rep. Grim elected to House Democratic Leadership

On Tuesday, January 23, Rep. Michele Grim was elected by her colleagues in the Ohio House Democratic Caucus to serve as Assistant Minority Whip for the 135th General Assembly.

Kid Influencer Protection Act would establish new safeguards

Joined by former child star, advocate, and Toledo native Alyson Stoner, Rep. Michele Grim and Rep. Lauren McNally (D-Youngstown) introduced H.B. 376 The Kid Influencer Protection Act on January 9th.

The bill requires adult vloggers featuring children to set aside a minimum contribution of their profit in a trust for when that child turns 18 and empowers former child performers to request the removal of their image from social media platforms once they've turned 18.
