Information and Key Dates about the Upcoming Election

Voting is one of the most fundamental rights that we have. Make sure you have a plan to vote in this upcoming November election, where we will vote to determine our future. Make your voice heard!

Here are some upcoming dates and deadlines that might be helpful:

- · Friday, November 1: Early in-person voting at the Board of Elections (7:30 a.m.-7:30 p.m.)
- Saturday, November 2: Early in-person voting at the Board of Elections (8:00 a.m.-4:00 p.m.)
- · Sunday, November 3: Last day for Early in-person voting at the Board of Elections (1:00 p.m.-5:00 p.m.)
- · Monday, November 4: Mailed absentee ballots must be postmarked by this date.
- · Tuesday, November 5: Election Day

Vote at your local polling location (Polls open 6:30 am-7:30 pm)
Remaining absentee ballots must be returned in person to Board of Elections by 7:30 p.m.

If you requested an absentee ballot and then go to your polling place to vote, you will be given a provisional ballot.

Ohioans are required to present one of the following forms of photo ID (must not be expired)

- · Ohio Driver License
- · Ohio State ID Card / Ohio State ID Interim Documentation
- · U.S. Passport or passport card
- · Military ID card (Ohio National Guard ID or U.S. Department of Veterans Affairs ID)



National Alzheimer's Awareness Month
