I am focused on continued efforts to better engage more young people-especially our graduating seniors- to participate in the civic process by getting registered to vote and learning about upcoming elections. In our continued fight for reproductive rights, Rep. Dr. Anita Somani and I introduced House Bill 502, the <u>Protect Assistive Reproductive Technology Act</u>. This legislation will provide civil and criminal immunity for providers, facilities, or health care personnel who provide assistive reproductive care, as well as for the patients seeking care. In addition, the legislation will provide data protections for patients, ensuring that third party organizations do not have access to private medical information. Every Ohioan deserves the right to build a family through assisted reproductive technology without fear of being prosecuted. This legislation will support families navigating infertility without adding to the emotional and financial stress they are already experiencing.

This May, I recognize and celebrate our educators in honor of Teacher Appreciation Week. I especially would like to take the opportunity to recognize the outstanding educators who teach students in House District 4 and educators who live in House District 4. Thank you to all our educators and school staff who work hard each and every day to ensure our children and students are receiving the best education and care possible. That's why we support legislation to guarantee every Ohioan, no matter where they live, has a quality education. Democrats delivered a major win for education by continuing to fund the Fair School Funding Plan that would invest more money in our public schools. Legislative Update

Rep. Skindell and I introduced <u>House Bill 490</u>, which would designate the third Sunday in November as "Road Traffic Victims Day of Remembrance. This day honors the people killed or seriously injured on the roads of Ohio and to encourage road safety and support for crash survivors and their families. This will coincide with the World Day of Remembrance, a high-profile global event to remember the many millions who have been killed and injured on the world's roads and to acknowledge the suffering of all those affected. We must advocate for policies that protect all road users.

On April 9, Rep. Grim and I gave Sponsor Testimony on <u>House Bill 467</u> in the Government Oversight Committee. This bill proposes a modest change to the requirement that candidates for public office must disclose all names used in the past five years on their Declaration of Candidacy portion of their nominating petition. HB 467 would add an exemption to disclosure if that change of name was granted by any court in the state of Ohio. It would also update the Declaration of Candidacy Forms and the Ohio Candidate Requirement Guide. This bill had a second hearing for Proponent Testimony on Tuesday.

Me and my colleagues are working on a number of bills to improve K-12 Education. This week, I introduced <u>HB</u> <u>581: the Charter School Oversight Act</u>, <u>HB 582: the School Busing Improvement Act</u>, and <u>HB 592: the School</u> <u>Rating Enhancement Act</u>. May is Mental Health Awareness Month

Mental Health Awareness Month is observed in May and addresses the challenges faced by millions of Americans living with mental health conditions. This month is a time to be dedicated to eradicating the stigma around mental health, extending support, fostering public education and advocating for policies that prioritize the well-being of individuals and families affected by mental illness.

Mental health is one of the top health shortfalls that puts Ohio at the low end of state rankings (44th), and racial disparities continue to impact residents. House Democrats have been strong advocates for expanding mental-health services while supporting investments for services, research, and job development, championing bill like:
