Property Tax Update

I appreciate the numerous constituents who have called, emailed, and met with me to share their concerns with our current property tax system. You are not alone—homeowners across Central Ohio are feeling squeezed by the state's inaction to curb rising property taxes.

Bills to address this issue will be high priority to me as the legislature resumes session this fall. As your Representative, I'm fighting to cut your property taxes. I'm fighting for a fairer tax system for all Ohioans— one that enables our communities to remain welcome to Ohioans of all ages and incomes. Here are some of the ways we are working in legislature to address this issue:

Establishing the Joint Committee on Property Tax Review and Reform to simplify the state's burdensome tax system.

Advocating for an increased homestead exemption and freezing property taxes for those over 65 so that seniors can afford to stay in their home.

Helping pass the Fair School Funding Plan to stop the state from cutting money to our schools so you aren't forced to pay more locally to make up for state cuts.

Working across the aisle to pass legislation that permits a property-tax reduction for surviving spouses of service members killed in the line of duty.

Supporting a statewide property-tax circuit-breaker to send \$1000 rebates to homeowners saddled with unaffordable property taxes.

Unfortunately, increased property taxes are a choice by the partisan majority at the Statehouse. Historic state giveaways—over \$2 billion worth — for millionaires and big corporations means less money for schools and first responders, leaving our communities with the impossible choice of raising taxes or cutting services. This isn't cutting taxes in Columbus. It's shifting taxes in our community— making you pay more locally so the state can pay less.

But this doesn't have to be our reality! We can lower your property taxes and decide to fund the essential services and infrastructure that improve your quality of life. Together, we can support policies and leaders to unrig Ohio's tax system and stop shifting the state's tax responsibility onto individual homeowners and our communities.
