Early Wins and Big Budget Work Ahead

The start of the 135th General Assembly has been fast and furious. I was sworn in on January 6th, received my committee assignments shortly after, and hit the ground running with two major state budgets.

I'm proud to share that the House Transportation Committee unanimously passed the \$11.4B Transportation Budget (HB 54), and it sailed through the full Ohio House with that same strong support. This bill includes several key investments for our communities, including:

- \$8B for statewide highway construction and maintenance
- \$30M to continue the Ohio Workforce Mobility Partnership Program
- \$18M for Transportation Improvement Districts

The bill now moves to the Senate Finance Committee for consideration.

Meanwhile, work continues on the State Operating Budget (HB 96), which must be finalized and balanced by July 1, 2025. As this process unfolds, I remain committed to ensuring that your voice—and the needs of our communities—are reflected in the final budget.

State Rep. Veronica Sims proudly serves on several key House committees, where she advocates for policies that support working families, local governments, and economic equity across Ohio.

<u>Local Government Committee (Ranking</u> Member)

Reviews legislation affecting cities, townships, counties, and other local entities.

Government Oversight Committee

Examines the efficiency, transparency, and accountability of state agencies and government functions.

Agriculture Committee

Responsible for matters relating to Ohio's agricultural industry, food production, rural development, and environmental concerns.

Finance Committee

Oversees the creation of the state's biennial budget and other major fiscal legislation, allocating funding for public programs, education, infrastructure, and more.

Sunset Review Committee

This committee evaluates state boards and commissions to determine whether they should continue, be restructured, or be eliminated to ensure efficient use of public resources.

HB 65 – Enact the Agriculture Appreciation

This bill aims to recognize and promote awareness of the importance of agriculture. it includes several agricultural observances in Ohio such as FFA Week, Ohio Soil Health Week, 4-H Week, National Farmers Market Week, Ohio Storm water Awareness Week, Farmers Day, and Agriculture Day.

Status: Passed by the House Rep. Sims' Position: Co-Sponsor

HB 29 – Regards inmates' access to feminine hygiene products and showers This legislation mandates standards for providing feminine hygiene products and daily showers to female inmates in municipal, county, and state correctional facilities in Ohio at no cost, tailored to individual needs. Other provisions of this bill include:

- Prohibition of discrimination in access based on identity or status.
- procedure creation for sanitary storage, distribution, and disposal.

HB 34 – Increase the state minimum wage This Legislation aims to implement a phased increase of the long overdue Ohio minimum wage to \$15 per hour by 2030. it includes post 2030 adjustments for inflation by the director of the Department of Commerce. The bill also includes a wage increase for tipped workers by \$0.50 per year for five years.
