In Columbus:

In March I introduced two pieces of legislation: House Bill 150, and House Bill 204. House Bill 150, the Clock Kids Out Act, is intended to enforce child labor laws and protect our children from entering the workforce prematurely. House Bill 204 commemorates the 6888th Battalion for their efforts during World War II. The House also voted on Senate Bill 1, I spoke out against this legislation and what it would do to working people on the House floor. I also joined the Ohio House Democratic Caucus in signing a letter urging Governor Dewine to veto this bill. I am proud to be representing Ohio 41 and will continue to speak out on behalf of my constituents.



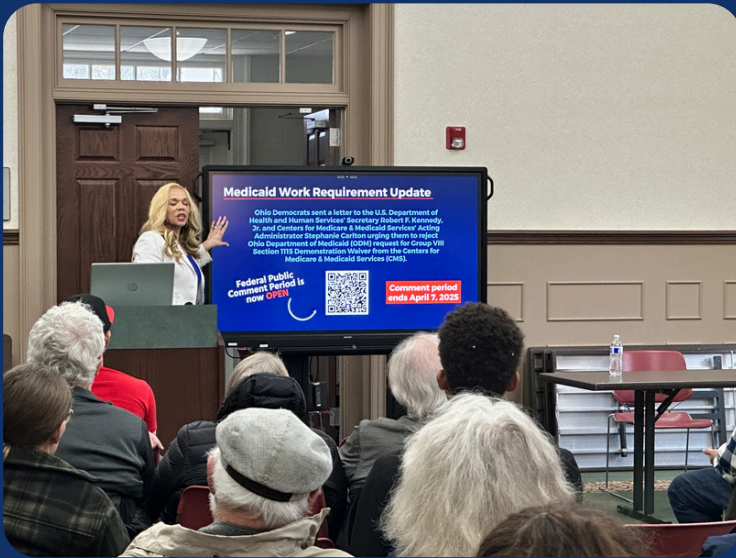
