Dear Governor DeWine:

I respectfully ask that you use your executive powers to veto Substitute Senate Bill 157. This bill threatens the health, safety and security of patients during pregnancy and unduly restricts access to women's health care in Ohio.

Sub. Senate Bill 157 puts the lives of patients in danger by interfering with their ability to consult with their physicians and make appropriate medical decisions during pregnancy. Every pregnancy is different, and patients should be free to make health decisions that are best for them. SB 157, however, infringes on these freedoms and creates unnecessary interference when medical crisis occurs.

Further, doctors and other medical professionals already have an obligation through current federal and state law to provide appropriate life-saving medical care in the end-of-life situations discussed in Sub. S.B. 157. This bill is redundant and unnecessary.

Sub. S.B. 157 also threatens access to abortion care across the state due to an added provision that would change the way ambulatory surgical facility licenses are governed by the Ohio Department of Health (ODH). The extreme restrictions places the variances for some abortion clinics at risk, particularly in southwest Ohio, where Cincinnati could become the largest metropolitan area in the country without an abortion clinic. This bill criminalizes care, threatens the health and safety of patients and families, and is a major step back for personal and medical freedom for all Ohioans.

While we can disagree on the abortion issue, we can agree that criminalizing care and putting the government between patients and their doctors during a time when the focus should solely be on an individual's personal care benefits no one.

Please veto this legislation. I stand ready to work with you on ways to improve women's health care. This is something we can all agree must be a priority. Thank you for your attention and consideration.
